From Jane's Desk....

Dear All

This month I am trying hard to learn some new things so I will share some of what I have learnt with you. I have often wondered how much, if any, of Thailand is below sea level. Flooding seems a constant problem and I wanted to find out if this was due to low lying land or just lots of water! Bangkok



itself lies approximately 2 metres above sea level. However according to varying figures it is sinking somewhere between 5 and 10cm every year – not so good if you plan to be here more than 10 years! I did some research into other low lying countries and was quite surprised to see where the really low lying areas are. I had presumed that Bangladesh which always seems to be having problems with floods was below sea level but the problem there is that about 80 percent of the land is made of lowland area called the Bangladesh Plain. The plain is part of the larger Plain of Bengal. Some parts of this plain are as high as 105 metres above sea level but most areas are less than 10 metres above sea level and in the southern coastal areas the land is mainly at sea level. With such low lying land, coupled with so many rivers, flooding is a predominant physical feature.

However, the lowest lying land areas in the World are in Israel around the Dead Sea where the land is 418m below sea level. Other low lying land areas include the Sea of Galilee, Israel (208 m) Turfan Depression, China (154 m) Lac Assal, Djibouti (153 m) Qattara Depression, Egypt (133 m) Caspian Depression, Karagiye, Kazakhstan (132 m) Afar Depression, Ethiopia (125 m) Many of these areas have very low annual rainfall so that is probably why we do not hear about them flooding!

I had always thought of Holland as low lying and indeed it does have some low lying areas including Amsterdam Schiphol Airport which is 4m below sea level but like Thailand has a little more rainfall than those places listed above.

Anyway, that is quite enough knowledge for one month so back to SILC business. This month we have our **Annual Charity Bazaar on Wednesday 29**th **October**. This is once again being held at Bangkok Patana school and we look forward to seeing you there – see inside for more details about how you can help!

It is normally a fantastic day and a brilliant way to start your Christmas shopping.

We will have our normal coffee mornings and lunches etc which we would love to see you at too. If you bump into any ladies new to Bangkok please feel free to invite them along. Although we do like people to join SILC we also appreciate that when you are new it is sometimes difficult to decide which groups you want to join and which you don't and we are more than happy to greet some new faces even if they decide SILC is not for them. The same always goes for any visitors you may have, Mums, Grans, Sisters, friends and even male relatives are all welcome so bring them along, the more the merrier. 



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Happy Diwali

Diwali, the popular festival of Indians, celebrates the return of Lord Rama and Sita from exile. Diwali is also called as the festival of lights. It usually falls between 15th October and 15th November. This year it is on 28th October.

It is celebrated because on that day hundreds of years ago lord Ram returned home to Ayodhya after 14 years of being into exile.

It also celebrates the day Mother Goddess destroyed a demon called 'Mahisha' & Victory of Good over evil.


The day is celebrated by lighting lamps, diyas, visiting relatives, feasting, and displaying fireworks.

Diwali is celebrated with a variety of rituals, which depend in large part on one's location, but they center on the lighting of candles, electric lights and fireworks.

The "row of lights" for which the festival is named are lit on the new-moon night to welcome Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth. Throughout the five-day festival, small earthenware lamps filled with oil are lighted and placed in rows along the tops of temples and houses and set adrift on rivers and streams.

Gambling is encouraged during the Diwali season as a way of ensuring good luck for the coming year and in remembrance of the games of dice played by the Lord Shiva and Parvati on Mount Kailasa or between Radha and Krishna. In honour of Lakshmi, the female player always wins during Diwali.

The fourth day — the main day of Diwali and the beginning of the lunar month of Karttika — marks the beginning of the new year according to the Vikrama calendar. On this day, merchants perform religious ceremonies and open new account books. It is generally a time for visiting, exchanging gifts, cleaning and decorating houses, feasting, setting off fireworks displays, and wearing new clothes.

Foster parents provide temporary homes for cats prior to adoption and for cats needing time to recover from an illness or injury. It's a wonderful and rewarding way to contribute to saving homeless pets and a fun and flexible way to volunteer some of your free time. Best of all it's a great way to enjoy a pet if you are unable right now to make a lifetime commitment to adopting one.

Skills needed... It's good to have knowledge about companion animal behaviors and health, but at SCAD we provide basic cat-care training. Most cats adjust quickly and just need some TLC and time in a home environment to learn to trust.

What else is required? A spare bedroom or bathroom — or for anyone wishing to help longer term, a garden or balcony closed-in area. Cat fostering is suitable for apartment or house dwellers, but to better facilitate easy viewing for potential adopters, a central Bangkok location is preferred. Foster parents have to be prepared to visit the vet for vaccinations and other health issues, and be willing to set aside time for play and interaction, and regular updates to SCAD.

Taking a cat into your home, loving it and then letting it go requires a special kind of person. A cat foster parent role is to prepare the kitty for adoption into a loving home.



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

The Earliest Version: Magic Squares

Sudoku as we know it was not created until 1976. Other numbers games have existed since as early as 2800 BC, however. The earliest puzzles, known as "magic squares," featured a set of integers whose rows, columns, and diagonals all add to the same sum, usually a number with a value of significance to a particular culture. For example, the rows, columns, and diagonal in an ancient Chinese magic square always totaled fifteen, the number of days in each of the twenty-four cycles of the Chinese solar year. A magic square carved on the Sagrada Famila church in Barcelona adds to thirty-three, the age of Jesus at the time of his crucifixion

One Step Closer: Latin Squares

In medieval times, a new rule transformed Magic Squares to Latin Squares. While Magic Squares could repeat a number in any given row or column, Latin Squares prohibit such repetition. In a Latin Square, a certain set of numbers or symbols appear once in each column and once in each row

The Creation of Sudoku

While the name Sudoku is Japanese, the modern version of the logic-driven number game actually originated in the United States. Howard Garnes, a seventy-four-year-old retired architect and freelance puzzle constructor, added the nine 3x3 subgroups to a standard 9x9 Latin Square. He submitted the first known Sudoku puzzle to Dell Magazines, a specialist puzzle publisher, in New York for publication. Not yet labeled as Sudoku, however, the game debuted in Dell Pencil Puzzles and Word Games as "Number Place."

Going Global

Five years after its creation, the puzzle drifted across the Pacific Ocean to Japan, where Nikoli, Japan's leading puzzle company, picked it up and published it as Suuji Wa Dokushin Ni Kagiru, which means "the numbers must be single," or "the numbers must occur only once."

The Japanese puzzle fans loved the game. The president of Nikoli realized that the game's success was hindered only by its long, unwieldy name, and shortened the title to Sudoku, or "single digit." Nikoli also reduced the amount of given clues, and made those given appear symmetrically in the grid. Sudoku's popularity grew, and today, Japan alone publishes over 600,000 copies of Sudoku magazines every month.

Shannon was stunned. 'That's impossible! GoTo is a kid my age! He's 14. And he lives in Michigan!'


