THE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION FARM A PLACE OF REFUGE FOR STREET KIDS

April 21, 2000

To all members of SILC,

We at the Human Development Foundation wish to thank all of the members of the Samutprakarn International Ladies' Club for your generous pledge and for your concern for the street kids who will be cared for at the HDF Farm. Many of these children have lived in alleys, under bridges or in otherwise abusive situations, and do not even know what a home is. With the help of caring people like yourselves, we hope to provide a home, an education and hope for 30-40 such children. The children who will be cared for at the Farm range in age from 6 years up through their teens. Our hope is that this diversity in age will provide a family setting in which these children can learn to care for each other, and through that, learn to care for themselves and society.

The Farm is located in Cha Chang Sao, about 45 minutes east of Bangkok. The land is provided to the HDF by a Thai woman (who wanted to do something to help these children), for as long as it is needed. The funds that SILC will donate will be used to extend the kitchen to provide a much-needed cooking area for this large brood of children. We also plan to build a chicken house and raise chickens to help feed the children at a more reasonable cost. This will also teach the children to care for the chickens and to feel more self-sufficient. If funds allow, we also hope to build a laundry area, so that the children can also begin to learn how to take care of their own clothing. All of these things will help to build a feeling of community, pride in themselves and self-sufficiency among the children.

The future of any culture depends on the future provided for its children. That is why this kind of project is so very important to the future of Thailand. Father Joe has always said that the best way to help the poor to help themselves is to educate their children. We believe this will all of our hearts, and we are so grateful to all of you for giving from your hearts to help make this project possible.

COMMITTEE MEMBERS DUTIES

PRESIDENT

Preside at all meetings, affix signature to all official contracts entered not by SILC. To serve as the official representative of SILC. She will chair the committee meetings as well as other club events at which she presides.

VICE PRESIDENT

Shall assume duties of the president in her absence, will assume any responsibilities delegated by the President from time to time and is responsible for all matters concerning the Monthly Meetings, including arranging guest speakers or social focus, venue and purchasing wine and beer and gift for guest speaker.

SECRETARY

Shall record and keep the minutes of all official meetings and give them to Committee members before the next meeting. She will have charge of all documents not specifically under the charge of any other Officer and will handle all correspondence for the club. She will keep a newsletter for each month on file.

TREASURER

She will be custodial of all funds and will be responsible for or will give authority to others to collect monies for annual subscriptions and receipt of all monies. She shall appoint a sub-editor if necessary and will also be responsible for collation, labelling and distribution of the newsletter.

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY
