
Pre-dinner drinks will commence at 7.30 pm and dinner will be served at 8.00 pm. Dress is "smart casual".

Kids and Dogs: 10 Do's and Don'ts

- 1. Don't approach dogs you don't know without the permission of the owner. Not all dogs are friendly and some may bite.
- 2. If adults tell you it's OK to pet their dog, don't run, scream or shout, and don't poke at, grab, or hug the dog or pound on its head. Do approach slowly and quietly, and allow the dog to sniff your hand before you pet it gently under its chin or on its chest. It is best not to reach down from above a dog's head.
- 3. Don't attempt to touch or pet a dog that growls, snarls or runs away from you.
- 4. Don't play roughly with any dog.
- 5. Don't try to pet a dog through fences, car windows or cages, and don't approach a dog that is tied up.
- Don't try to take bones, food or toys from a dog.
- 7. Don't frighten or startle any dog, especially when it is sleeping.
- 8. Don't try to punish a dog in any way, even if you think the dog has been naughty.
- 9. If a dog you don't know comes up to you, don't run or yell, and don't look directly into its face.

 Do stand perfectly still, watch the dog out of the corner of your eye, and walk away slowly after a minute or two.
- 10. Do treat all dogs, cats and other animals kindly and humanely.

Why do I want a dog?

What type of dog will I choose? Know the typical behaviors expected from the breed you want to adopt.

How will I teach the dog the rules of the house? Chewing, barking, digging and house soiling are normal dog behaviors until effectively trained.

Do I have enough time and energy for daily care activities? Dogs require food, water, exercise, care and companionship every day of every year of their lives.

Have I considered the costs involved in caring for a dog? License, food, grooming, toys and medical care, including spay or neuter surgery.

Am I looking for a pet for my child? According to research, the responsibility and daily care for pets usually becomes the mother's obligation, regardless of initial plans involving children. Make sure YOU as the parent want the dog.

Are dogs allowed where I live? Get permission, preferably in writing, before committing.

Do I have enough space to house a dog properly? Chaining a dog in a confined area — aside from being cruel — usually leads to behavior problems.

Will I mind the constant fight to control hair shedding, fleas and odors? Will these duties burden and annoy me? Am I, my friends or relatives allergic to pet hair?

Will I be a responsible pet owner by providing vaccinations, identification, prompt health care, spaying or neutering for my dog?

How will my dog be cared for when I am away? If you don't have a friend or neighbor you can rely on, is there a kennel with a good reputation and can you afford the costs? Will the level of care be acceptable?

Am I committed to keep and care for my dog for its entire lifetime, even when I move or my lifestyle changes?

Lyn, I still have your pen. Thanks so much for not helping me get out of the write up.

As many times as I've been on Thonglor, it's only been to go to the vet or to get to somewhere else. Now that I've bothered to really have a look, I have found some nice frames that I'd been looking for - in a building that I would never have gone into had I gone a-walking on my own (although that's not a bad idea either - except when are you going to do it??!) I also picked up 2 birthday presents for kids at a toy store in this same building (another good reason to go on a SILC tour; you could get lucky). This was in the Home Building, where we began our walk. Next I believe we went tripping into the Retro store to say, 'Sock it to me', and I saw chairs that we had in our home when I was 3. We would have seen the 'Castle Building' but on Audrey's recon visit, it was half-standing with a wrecking ball in the middle of it; but we did zip past the Log Cabin building which serves nice Thai food and the Teak Building was also pretty to look at. However, when I tried to take a picture the guard wouldn't let me. I think sometimes a whistle goes to people's heads. Inside are portrait studios where the group spent an awfully long time for married folks (!?!) Of course, you can have family portraits done as well; and if it's good enough for the Minister of Military, Chavalit, and Governor Samak

We strolled into a high-end pet store with everything from Harley Davidson leashes and snoopy clothespins to fresh-baked bickies from the bow-wow bakery! They did have nice strong collars and leashes, which I've never seen anywhere, and you can also eat next door accompanied by your adoring pet. We don't know if they get to sit at the table with you, or what. Food or drink was not an issue as we passed by plenty of street vendors and shop restaurants, including Budapest Restaurant, which was on our list. We passed Photo Cake Express where edible logos and messages can be incorporated into your desserts; a high-end furniture store that had some Xmas decorations, of all things, that I wouldn't have minded buying. Point of interest No. 2 was the Camilian Hospital because it was one of the first hospitals in Bangkok (set up by missionaries). Point of interest No. 1 being the name, Thonglor, researched by Kate's husband, Mike, and meaning gold foundry. The area was formerly where merchants came with their gold to make into ingots. This still carries auspicious associations so there are many bridal shops (I counted 8) along our route. On the way to Point of Interest No. 3, I spotted a pick up truck at the curb with a sticker on its window, "I Never Think Artist", (I love those darn things -what does it mean?) and 2 1/2 open sewers. I was just a little pleased with myself when I could come up with some bit of lore of my own on the 'Dragon building' (POI #3). My driver tells me that the location of the building is unlucky due to its position on the road directly across from a Soi seeming to head straight for it at the T- junction. Therefore, it is adorned with creatures and odd shaped protuberances which are Chinese for Good Luck. The bar across the street has a large bamboo model of a building alongside it, which has always fascinated me, and a picture of my hat on the sign as pointed out by one of my walking mates. Some comments on the 'tour' from many of us as we reflected on the morning: It wasn't hot; It wasn't sticky; It wasn't flooded; There weren't any dead dogs (so it wasn't icky?)






