The History of SILC

In March 1992 two ladies were together at the lakeside Villa 1 swimming pool. They came up with a great idea of forming a social club in the Bangna Trat area. At that time the area involved was mainly from Lakeside 1 and 2, Srinakarin Road and the end of Sukhumvit Soi 105. The idea was to get together not only socially, but also to do some activities together to make the best use of the time, as the traffic was particularly bad in those days. The idea was to get enough people together, who had different talents and loads of time to spare. We could do things together without having to go into Bangkok, an experience which inevitably involved several hours of pain and anguish sitting in traffic. So forms were distributed during evening walks or when seeing new faces at Bangkok Patana School (I received my form during one of these evening walks!) Well the day for the first meeting arrived and to everyone's surprise almost 30 ladies showed up. The idea was presented and the response was tremendous, thus SILC was officially born. A president (now Chairman) and a vice president were elected and members were assigned to different committees. The first few months were hectic. The active members were running around in different directions to get as much information as possible about the Samutprakarn area. The results were fantastic. Several activities were organized by different members with various talents. These included aerobics, a book club and tennis to name but a few. The club was definitely up and running, with many regular activities taking place. The atmosphere created by the club was warm and welcoming, like a family. After all the club meetings and activities were set, the club members turned their attention to aiding under privileged children and adults. Since I had lived in Thailand for many years and had already been part of a group (ISG) doing social welfare work, I was able to provide a lot of information about welfare homes. In the mean time I had started giving Indian Cooking classes to some very interested members. This provided an opportunity for our first fundraising event -'An Indian evening'. All members who took the cooking classes cooked food and later in the evening I provided traditional and new Indian clothing for a fashion show. It was a great evening and we were able to collect 15,500 THB, however, we had still not decided how we were going to spend it. Then one of our members found out about the Chanjaprook foundation. This was a foundation run by a Dr Cleopan who took babies that had been born inside prison to the foundation where they could be cared for whilst their mothers served their sentences. We decide that this was where our money should go so, a few members, myself included, went to present the money to Dr Cleopan. After that the welfare groups went to many different places.

Over the years the welfare committee has continued to do wonderful work in and outside the Bangna area. Looking back now, the club has come a long and successful way with many new members and ideas. Thai children and adults have certainly benefited from the generosity and hard work of SILC Members.

Feng Shui update from Anna Leong

Dear Friends,

Happy New Year and welcome to my Feng Shui update.

The year of the Earth Ox 2009 is a year blessed by the presence of all five elements. It is one of the best years of this period, much better than the previous years.

This is a crucial recovery year with good money to be made due to the Paht Chee Chart 2009 and there are no missing elements so it is a balanced chart. This should be a productive year and it will start and end well.

For those of you who have yet to transform your house and office energies to that Period 8, please do so this year.

4th February 2009 is the official day of "Lap Chun" which marks the first day of spring. It is considered to be the day when the energies of our surroundings move to a new location to conform to the energies of the New Year. Try not to move furniture or have too much activity around the house on this day to allow the new Chi (energy) coming into your house to have a chance to settle down. So if you need to move your furniture, do so before the Chinese New Year and place all your cures in the afflicted sectors at the same time.

Spring clean your whole house, get rid of all old junk especially and broken items and clear up any clutter. This is a time to wash the curtains and shampoo your carpets to get rid of dirt and stale energy. Do a space purification with incense sticks, a singing bowl or bell a few days before Chinese New Year Eve.

Change the red packet at the bottom of your rice urn (container) with a new one and add in new money to signify new income. You can keep back some of the old money inside together with the new money. The old money signifies the retention of old wealth. Fill your rice urn full to the brim. Even rice cookers should not be left empty or half full on New Year's Eve. So after dinner, cook another pot of rice. Whether you eat the rice or not does not matter. To have your rice pot full means you will have plenty to eat and have a good income the whole year round.

Clean your wealth vase and change the food for the wealth God inside your vase. You can add in more "treasures" if you like, or better still create extra new wealth vases and place them around the whole house. Add in at least one new wealth vase each year and watch your wealth grow tremendously! This is truly amazing. If you do not have a wealth vase, try to create one this year and watch what happens. Wealth ships are also very potent wealth energizers.

Buy lots of mandarin oranges, as much as you can afford, and display them around the whole house throughout the 15 days of the New Year. Do not keep your oranges in the fridge. Some oranges might not last for 15 days so keep replacing them with fresh ones. In Chinese, oranges are phonetically similar to the word "Kum" meaning gold. When friends or relatives give you oranges you must bring them home and keep them. Giving away your oranges to another friend means you are giving away the "wealth" which was given to you. Make sure you wear something red whether you are at home or visiting friends during the Chinese New Year. Do not wear black when you go visiting as the colour is much frowned upon during this 15 day period.

Have plenty of fresh flowers and plants around your whole house (except in bedrooms). "Nga ku" narcissus pants are particularly good. Other plants can be lime trees, pussy willow, tulips, jade plants or daffodils. Decorate the entrance of homes with all these auspicious plants. Hang red packets ("ang pow") on your trees or plants but make sure they are not empty. Note that in 2009, the auspicious Star 8 flies to the Southeast, so it is extremely lucky to place healthy plants and water features in this corner of your house or office to bring wealth, success and happiness.

Make sure brooms and dustpans stay out of sight on New Year's Day. Usually I will throw away all my brooms and mops and use new ones for the New Year. I even wash my dust bins to get rid of old dirt.

On the eve of Chinese New Year turn on some lights, especially around your front entrance to welcome in the Year of the Earth Ox.

To tap the luck of the Ox, display a symbolic statue of the Ox in your home and office. Put the Ox symbol surrounded by oranges in your sitting room throughout the 15 days of the Chinese New Year.

Every child, big or small, loves receiving red packets so do give generously to all children that visit you. Having lots of children running about your whole house is very lucky because their energy is so pure and vibrant and will create precious "yang" energy in your home so make sure they are happy and have plenty to eat. Spoil them rotten during this period and whatever you do, do not make them cry.

Repay all debts before the Chinese New Year Day.

Learn to forgive and do not hold grudges against any of your relatives or friends. Be more loving and make everyone happy during this period. When they are happy they think nice thoughts of you and this wonderful positive energy you are receiving from them is something that money cannot buy. What a nice way it is to start off the New Year with such wonderful feelings.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all my new and old friends a very Happy, Healthy and Fruitful New Year and I truly hope that in the Year of the Earth Ox all your wishes will come true.

FENG SHUI CHART FOR 2009

Place cures before the Chinese New Year. Each year the annual flying stars change positions. Good and Bad stars fly into different sectors so to practice time dimension Feng Shui effectively it is vital to know the location of these stars, both to subdue bad luck brought by afflicted stars and to activate the luck stars with symbolic enhancers to bring you wealth, success and happiness.

AFFLICTION STARS

- THE FIVE YELLOWS This is a misfortune star that brings misfortune and accidents. It also brings ear and kidney problems to those who stay in this area. This sector can also affect those born in the Year of the Rat and the middle son. The remedy is the Five Element Pagoda or Five Element Bell. Remove Earth and Fire energy from the North sector. Keep the North as quiet as possible, no renovation, digging, knocking or cutting of trees in this sector.
- THE ILLNESS STAR 2 flies to the West, affecting the youngest daughter and those who reside there. This brings illness to lungs and the nose. Those born in the Year of the Rooster are affected. An excellent remedy is the Whirling Wu Lou wind chime, 8 Immortals Wu Lou, Medicine Buddha or the Arcala Disc and Ball placed in the West sector of your home. Pregnant women and elderly people should move to another room. Remove Earth and Fire energy from this sector.
- THE QUARRELSOME STAR 3 flies to the Northeast, bringing litigation, quarrels, misunderstandings and trouble with the authorities. It afflicts those born in the Years of the Ox and Tiger and young boys. Keep this part of the home quiet. Place the Metal Ksiddigarbha Fireball or the Manjushri Sword in this sector.
- THE ROBBERY STAR 7- flies to the East bringing burglary and violence. If you have a door or window in this sector make sure it is properly locked at night or when you are away. This star particularly affects the eldest son and those born in the Year of the Rabbit. Place a blue rhino or elephant with its trunk up as powerful remedies.
- ANNUAL 3 KILLINGS This year it is located in the East, also known as "sarm saat". Never have this direction behind you. Those belonging to the West group should take note of the fact that they must not face West in 2009 or they will suffer from 3 types of misfortune: loss of wealth caused by people who cheat and betray you, loss of loved ones and loss of their good name. For the East group people it is excellent to confront the 3 killings but do not have your back to the 3 killings. In terms of cures we have been using the 3 celestial protectors comprising of the Chi Lin, Fu Dog and Pi Yao with great success for several years now. In 2009 you can continue to do so. You can also use the Trinity of Deities to suppress the 3 Killings.
- ANNUAL GRAND DUKE JUPITER Also known as Tai Sui or the God of the Year, he takes charge of all matters related to Earth and mankind throughout the duration of the year. It is absolutely vital that you know where he is residing each year. This year, he is located in the Northeast. DO NOT sit facing the NE this year (West group people please take note). Confronting the Grand Duke always brings misfortune, failure and loss. When you face the Tai Sui, nothing you do will go smoothly as obstacles surface unexpectedly and friends turn into adversaries. Also, do not disturb, renovate or dig in this direction. Those born in the Year of the Sheep are DIRECTLY in conflict with the Tai Sui.

Those born in the Year of the Dragon, Ox and Dog are indirectly in conflict with the Tai Sui.

All afflicted animal signs should carry the Grand Duke Appeaser Amulet to protect against misfortune. Carry or place a jade or metal Pi Yao in the Northeast corner of all rooms in the house which are frequently used.

AUSPICIOUS STARS

- THE WEALTH STAR 8 brings abundant wealth to the Southeast. It is most beneficial for those born in the Years of the Dragon or Snake. It also benefits young girls. Enhance this sector with a Yang Water Feature. This is an extremely auspicious star of the Year.
- THE HEAVEN STAR 6 is located in the Southwest. It brings speculative and windfall luck. Those born in the years of Monkey or Sheep will benefit from this star. This favourable white star is regarded as the indirect wealth star and it will bring unexpected good fortune for those who reside in this sector. Activate this sector with a symbol of the Triple Sheep or 8 Immortals crossing the great waters.
- THE WHITE STAR 1 This lucky white star flies into the Northwest bringing Victory luck, as well as career and education success. It benefits the Father and those born in the Years of the Dog or Boar. Place Kwan Kung, Dragon Tortoise or Victory Banner in this area to activate success at work, in business and in competitive situations.
- THE ROMANCE AND SCHOLASTIC STAR 4 Brings romance and good examination luck. This year it flies to the South. It benefits the Female and those born in the Year of the Horse. Enhance romance with a pair of Mandarin Ducks and study luck with a Chi Lin with scholastic objects or crystal points in the South Sector.

Seductive Amethysts

The birthstone for February

Who can ignore amethyst's seductive violet colour? Amazing that this gemstone was thought to protect you against seduction itself! And protect against drunkenness, as the name comes from the Greek word 'amethystos', meaning 'not intoxicated'! This is certainly a stone necessary to all of us ladies - no wonder Catherine the Great of Russia desired it so, she must have been to one of our SILC Parties!







From a gemmological point of view, amethyst is a member of the quartz family. Quartz is undoubtedly the single most common mineral on earth, made from the chemical molecule silicon dioxide or silica. There are so many forms of quartz, depending on the temperature and pressure when the gemstone was made, and which metals were around to give the colour. For amethyst in particular, the colour comes from iron plus some natural radiation under the earth's surface, producing tones from pale lilac to deep purple. It is often seen that stones have zones of these different tones. The most valuable colour is a rich velvet-like purple, not too dark and no colour-zoning; large stones may also show flashes of red!

If you heat amethyst to about 400 degC, you will find a citrine in its place! This is how 'ametrine', a combination of amethyst and citrine, is formed. As the colour change is permanent, we must be careful not to wear our amethyst jewellery whilst sunbathing!

Varieties of quartz have a hardness of 7. Hardness is how easily a stone can be *scratched* by another stone, eg, diamond is the hardness stone at 10 and can scratch all stones, sapphires are 9 and can scratch most stones except diamond, and we continue down to 1 where the stone cannot scratch anything, like the graphite in a lead pencil. As quartz is plentiful on our planet, most dust actually consists of minute quartz particles, giving dust a hardness of 7 too. This means that we shouldn't leave jewellery out gathering dust, as dust can cause damage.

Buyer beware! Amethyst stones can be easily produced in the lab, and it is estimated that about half the amethysts on the market are synthetic. Usually the colour is quite dark, and it is quite difficult to differentiate nature-made from man-made without access to a lab's expensive equipment. Usually the cost of the stone is much less than that of a lab report, so if you like the colour, the stone is 'cyc-clean' from inclusions, and the price is good, go for it!

Amethyst - Interesting 'Facets'!

* February birthstone

This is always a great thing to do. It's only a small token but they really look forward to it every year.

On the same day we went back to visit the family under the tree and brought along the tent that SILC purchased and some clothes that were donated. It's a nice size five man tent - so at least they were able to keep warm over that recent cold spell that we were having. There is now a second family living there so I don't know if we will provide another tent but if we do we might just encourage a whole community to turn up! I guess we can only help so many.

To get back to the Mahawong School, they are moving premises sometime this month. They have a new, bigger and better school, just built my FORDEC. It's in the same area but they will be taking in 150 children. Now that they have such a big number we don't think we will be able to continue doing the Friday morning activity. We were struggling at the end of last year to keep up with the 100 kids that we used to have. When we started going there two years ago it was only about sixty kids so it has grown considerably. We have decided to continue sending up the fruit every other week with the money that we collect from the Mahjong ladies. (A big thank you to all the ladies who continue to donate to this each week)

Earlier in December we made a visit to the Klong Toey slums to donate some money to Sister Joan Evans. Sister Joan is a wonderful Australian Nun who looks after a huge number of people in that slum area. She does an amazing job and most of her money comes from charity donations. One project that really appealed to us was the "milk run". The milk run is where every two weeks all the new moms and their babies come to receive powdered baby milk. This is a very well organized and run event but is also a very expensive one. The families are allowed to receive the milk for their babies for up to twelve months but in some cases, where the babies may have some special needs, it could be longer. So as you can imagine it is very costly. It cost about 120,000 baht a term to keep this project going. So that's what where we are looking at spending some of the money that we raised from last year's SILC events. Some may ask why these moms don't breast feed and the reason is that a lot of the moms suffer from HIV or some other related disease.



Bang Ka Jao Bike Tour - November 25 2008

On the 25 November thirteen women set off from Patana school in two mini vans loaded up with mountain bikes to go on a bike tour around the Bang Ka Jao area. It took approximately 25 minutes from Patana to our drop off point. Our bikes had already been set up in advance (we had to advise them on our height measurements the day before), so it was a pretty easy process of picking up the bike with your name on it!!

Within five minutes of setting off on our journey we had to jump off our bikes and head over to the other side of the river on a long tail boat. It was fascinating how many bikes, women and tour leaders you could get onto one boat!!!! Then we were off, it was an extremely pleasant ride through the countryside along very quiet roads, it felt like a hundred miles away from the hustle and bustle of Bangkok. Then the tour leader advised that we would be going off road and riding along the khlongs. This basically meant riding on a three foot cemented cycle track with a six foot drop either side of the path! It was a little hairy at times but incredibly entertaining, although we were told that some poor Australian lady had fallen into the Khlong the day before!!





During the tour the guides would stop periodically along the way, giving information on local temples, local produce and Buddism in general. We passed through many a local market and local Villages and even got to see some local women making Citronella burners.

At 12.00pm we stopped at a restaurant on the side of the road to savour some Pad Thai which was delicious, followed by pomelo and of course gallons of water as it was so hot!

It was then homeward bound back over the river and onto the mini



And then the fight started.....


